Leadership for Midwestern Watersheds connects a network of conservation professionals


Reducing agriculture's contribution to the Gulf of Mexico's hypoxic (low-oxygen) zone has proven to be a daunting environmental challenge. Sand County Foundation recognized that scaling up water quality improvements requires collaboration among leaders of individual watershed projects. We formed Leadership for Midwestern Watersheds (LMW) to foster regional cooperation needed to achieve our national water quality goals. This annual networking event encourages watershed leaders to share their knowledge and experiences to accelerate measurable water quality improvement outcomes in watersheds across the Midwest.

## **Annual Meeting Series**


Annual LMW meetings build new connections and explore key agricultural conservation issues with formal presentations and facilitated discussions. Since 2011, Sand County Foundation has hosted 12 meetings focusing on regional concerns such as farmer engagement, project financing, monitoring and evaluation, soil health, agricultural economics, and behavioral science. Our targeted audience includes national, state, and local conservation and agriculture focused agencies, national and local non-profit organizations, and most importantly, those who directly lead watershed projects on the ground.

## **Developing a Community of Practice**

In 2020 we completed a detailed survey of Midwestern watershed leaders to assess their project and professional development needs. We are working with partners to develop a web platform and digital forum for user-led information exchange and updates of emerging tools, practices, and funding opportunities. Our goal is to actively engage hundreds of watershed leaders through ongoing digital dialogue, in addition to convening annual in-person meetings.
